Uniform Dress Code 2026-2027

Please read our dress code policy carefully before purchasing to ensure purchased items meet the uniform requirements for the 2026-2027 school year. Some campus wear may be purchased at a retailer of your choice. However, not all uniform options/styles that retailers carry are MCS approved uniform wear. MCS khaki and navy uniform skirts and sweatpants for 2026-27 school year **MUST** be purchased in the MCS school store. MCS approved K-5 jumpers and approved skorts are available only at Shaheens or in the MCS school store. Shaheen's does offer K-5 boys' shorts and K-12 boys' and girls' pant options, as well, but approved pants and shorts can be found at many local retailers.

NOTICE: Plaid uniform skirts and jumpers were removed from the approved dress code for the 2026-27 school year.

MCS Girls Uniform (Approved M-F)

ALL K-12 Girls

- Polo shirt - cotton or polyester/dry-fit – white, light blue, or navy (no pockets or brand logos)
 - *No undergarments may be visible; a tank may be necessary*
- **MCS Approved spirit wear T-shirt**
- **Navy or khaki two kick-pleat skirt (**MUST** be purchased at the MCS school store)**
 - *The skirt must fall to the knee in both the front and back when standing*
- Uniform dress pants – khaki or navy – various cuts are permissible
 - *No jogger, cargo, or jegging style*

K-5 Girls ONLY

- White, button-up, short or long sleeve oxford shirt (with embroidered MCS Crest unless worn under a jumper)
- Drop waist jumper with two kick-pleat skirt – **khaki** or **navy**
 - *Available only at Shaheen's and the MCS school store*
- Uniform Skort – navy or **khaki**
 - *A skort must look like a skirt all the way around*
 - *Available only at Shaheen's and the MCS school store*
- Cartwheel shorts, biker shorts, or leggings **MUST** be worn under skirts and jumpers. Leggings must be a traditional style (no flair or bootcut); must be fitted and tapered.
- Uniform Classic, crewneck, cardigan or pullover sweater-navy
- Uniform Sweater vest - navy

6-12 Girls ONLY

- 8-inch privacy shorts or leggings are **REQUIRED** under skirts (*leggings are strongly recommended*). Leggings must be a traditional style (no flair or bootcut); must be fitted and tapered.
- White, button-up long-sleeve Oxford shirt (with embroidered MCS Crest)
- Uniform cardigan sweater - navy

Fridays ONLY

- MCS Approved Hoodies
- **MCS Branded sweatpants** (*must be purchased in the school store*)

MCS Boys Uniform (Approved M-F)

ALL K-12 Boys

- Polo shirt - cotton or polyester/dry-fit – white, light blue, or navy (no pockets or brand logos)
- White, button-up, long-sleeve Oxford shirt (with embroidered MCS Crest unless worn under an MCS quarter-zip or crewneck sweatshirt)
- **MCS Approved spirit wear T-shirt**
- Uniform dress pants – khaki or navy – various cuts are permissible
 - *No jogger, gathered, or cargo styles; pants must be worn at the normal waist height*

K-5 Boys ONLY

- Uniform shorts - navy or khaki (must be knee length)
- Uniform, Classic, crewneck, cardigan or pullover sweater – navy
- Uniform Sweater vest – navy

Fridays ONLY

- MCS Approved Hoodies
- **MCS Branded sweatpants** (*must be purchased in the school store*)

Uniform Outerwear (Approved M-F)

ALL K-12 Students

Only the following outerwear may be worn in classrooms during the school day. All items are available at the MCS school store.

- MCS approved dry-fit or knit, quarter-zip pullover in royal blue, navy, grey, black, or white
- MCS approved full zip jacket in royal blue, navy, grey, black, or white
- MCS approved crewneck sweatshirt in royal blue, navy, light blue, grey, black, or white

NOTE: K-5 students *must* wear a polo or spirit wear T-shirt under all outerwear
6-12 students *must* wear a polo, T-shirt, or tank under all outerwear

Footwear

- No flip flops
- All shoes must have a sole designed for outside wear
- Athletic shoes are required for P.E. class

NOTE: Please consult the handbook for the complete dress code.

*The MCS school store accepts gently used uniform donations and sells used items at a discounted price.



Cafeteria Software for 26/27 School Year

Dear Families,

WG Grinders Cafeteria Operations partners with Meal Magic for managing our lunch service software and online payments. **Credit Cards are the only form of payment accepted through the online payment portal.** Cash, checks (made payable to WG Grinders), and credit card deposits can be made in the cafeteria. The Family Portal for Meal Magic is very user-friendly and will allow you to transfer funds between siblings, set daily spending limits, and limit the purchase of certain items.

New users will need to set up an account at <https://wggrinders.familyportal.cloud/> to access lunch account information and make payment online. If you currently have an account through Family Portal, you will not need to register for a new account.

To set up a Family Portal Account, access the website and click on "My Account". Then click on "I need to register as a Family Portal user". Enter your email and follow the directions to complete the set up. When asked for ID number, you will need to add the prefix "60" to the beginning of the number to avoid duplication of accounts (Ex. 901201234). After registration, the account will need approval. The account approval process usually takes less than 24 hours.

Note: Any money that was left on your child's account at the end of the school year will show up on your child's account for the next school year automatically. There is nothing that you need to do for this to happen.

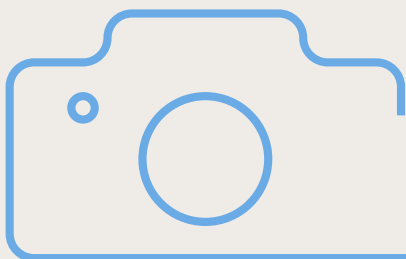

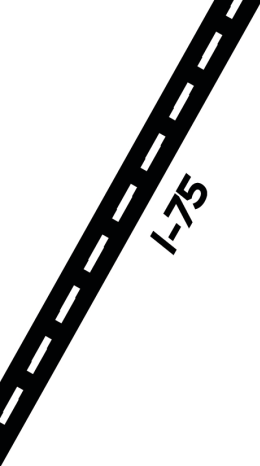


FALL *PICTURE* AUGUST 25 DAY

Fall Picture Day is coming on Tuesday, August 25th.

Students are permitted to wear dress clothes to school on picture day. All dress clothing must meet MCS uniform standards for length and modesty. Girls—all shirts must have a modest neckline. Girls must wear a knee-length skirt/dress OR dress pants (similar to the style of school approved school pants for girls) NO jeans or leggings. Girls choosing skirts/dresses, the lengths must measure to the knee, please note that some dresses have a sheer outer layer with an attached slip underneath the garment, the slip must measure to the knee as well. Boys— shirts must have sleeves. Boys grades K–5th may wear shorts similar to dress code shorts/pants (no jeans/denim). Boys 6–12th must wear pants that meet daily dress standards (similar to boys approved school pants) no jeans/denim.

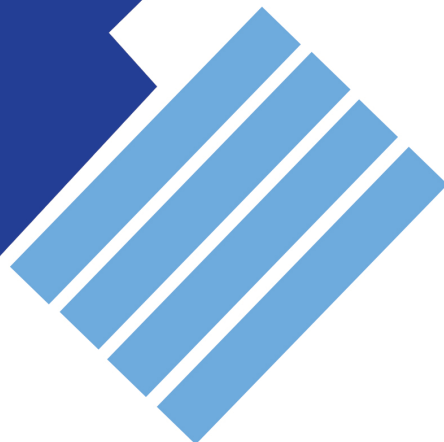

Middletown Christian Schools Anti-Bullying Policy

Policy Statement

Middletown Christian Schools prohibits acts of harassment, intimidation, or bullying. A safe school is necessary for students to learn and achieve. Harassment, intimidation, or bullying disrupts students' abilities to learn and therefore will not be tolerated.

Definition

“Bullying” or “harassment” or “intimidation” (together referred to as “bullying” for purposes of this policy) is any gesture or written, verbal, graphic, or physical act (including electronically transmitted acts – i.e., cyberbullying) exhibited toward another particular student more than once that is reasonably perceived as being dehumanizing, intimidating, hostile, humiliating, threatening, or otherwise likely to cause fear of physical or emotional harm.

Bullying may involve, but is not limited to:

- unwanted repeated teasing
- threatening
- intimidating
- stalking
- cyberstalking
- cyberbullying
- physical violence
- sexual, religious, or racial harassment
- public humiliation

- destruction of property
- rumor or spreading of falsehoods

Reporting an Incident of Bullying

Students may report complaints of bullying (whether directed toward themselves or others) to any faculty or staff member. All faculty and staff members must report, in writing, all allegations of bullying to the principal (Form AB-1). The principal must document, in writing, all complaints regarding bullying in order to ensure that problems are addressed appropriately and in a timely manner. Reporting incidents of bullying may be done anonymously (Form AB-2). Witnesses to the bullying incident are encouraged to fill out a report as well (Form AB-3).

Investigation

The principal is responsible for determining whether an alleged act is in violation of this policy. The principal shall conduct a prompt, thorough and complete investigation of the alleged incident. The principal will maintain a record of each investigation regarding bullying. The parents of the students involved shall receive notice from the school on the outcome of the investigation

Consequences

The following factors will be considered in determining the appropriate response to students that commit one or more acts of bullying:

- age, development, and maturity levels of the parties involved

- degree of harm
- surrounding circumstances
- nature of the behavior
- past incidences or continuing patterns of behavior
- relationships between the parties involved
- context in which the alleged incident(s) occurred

The following are examples of possible consequences should allegations of bullying prove true:

- admonishment/counseling/parent conference
- temporary removal from the classroom
- loss of privileges
- after-school detention
- in-school suspension
- out-of-school suspension
- expulsion
- legal action

Prevention

Middletown Christian Schools desires to prevent instances of bullying before they happen and relies upon the following to do so:

- the Word of God (Bible curriculum)
- classroom instruction (Health, Bible)
- classroom visits/instruction by the school principal or designee
- annual training for school employees
